SYLLABUS

- Knowledge of substance misuse and mental illness, including personality disorder and moderate severity mood disorder
- Assessment and intervention skills, care planning
- Research and its application to clinical practice
- Measurement of treatment outcomes
- Interagency and multi-disciplinary work

CREDITS: 30 credits at level 3 [University of Leeds]

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Appropriate learning to the value of 120 credits at level 1 or equivalent
and 120 credits at level 2 or equivalent
GCSE English Language

A practice-placement and practice mentor and appropriate client group
The ability to video record clinical practice
Mature entry route for students who do not meet the standard entry requirements.
